## First Reading

Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-11

The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me;
he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed,
to bind up the brokenhearted,
to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners;
${ }^{2}$ to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor,
and the day of vengeance of our God;
to comfort all who mourn;
${ }^{3}$ to provide for those who mourn in Zion-
to give them a garland instead of ashes,
the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit.
They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the LORD, to display his glory.
${ }^{4}$ They shall build up the ancient ruins, they shall raise up the former devastations;
they shall repair the ruined cities,
the devastations of many generations.

## Gospel

${ }^{23}$ May the God of peace himself sanctify you entirely; and may your spirit and soul and body be kept sound and blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. ${ }^{24}$ The one who calls you is faithful, and he will do this.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ${ }^{7}$ He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. ${ }^{8} \mathrm{He}$ himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light.
${ }^{19}$ This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" ${ }^{20} \mathrm{He}$ confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, "I am not the Messiah." ${ }^{21}$ And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the prophet?" He answered, "No." ${ }^{22}$ Then they said to him, "Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent
us. What do you say about yourself?" ${ }^{23} \mathrm{He}$ said,
"I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness
Make straight the way of the Lord,'" as the prophet Isaiah said.
${ }^{24}$ Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. ${ }^{25}$ They asked him, "Why then are you baptizing if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?" ${ }^{26}$ John answered them, "I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, ${ }^{27}$ the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal." ${ }^{28}$ This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.
